Understanding and Recognizing Opioid Overdose Emergencies:

There are certain signs you can look for to tell if someone is really high or overdosing. These include:

Really High	Overdosed
Muscles become relaxed	Pale, clammy skin
Speech is slowed or slurred	Breathing is infrequent or has stopped
Sleepy-looking	Deep snoring or gurgling (death rattle)
Responsive to shouting, ear lobe pinch, or sternum rub	Unresponsive to any stimuli
Normal heart rate and/or pulse	Slow or no heart rate and/or pulse
Normal skin tone	Blue lips and/or fingertips

REVIVE! is the Opioid Overdose and Naloxone Education (OONE) program for the Commonwealth of Virginia. REVIVE! provides training to professionals, stakeholders, and others on how to recognize and respond to an opioid overdose emergency with the administration of naloxone (Narcan ®).

Rapid REVIVE! trainings are for lay rescuers and take 5-10 minutes. This training covers understanding opioids, how opioid overdoses happen, risk factors for opioid overdoses, and how to respond to an opioid overdose emergency with the administration of Naloxone.

Please Dispose of Medication Properly

Why does safe drug disposal matter?

Intentional Misuse-especially controlled substances, such as pain medications - can be intentionally misused to get high. This can lead to addiction and death.

Accidental Use-Accidental drug overdose is one of the most common sources of household injury. These numbers have begun to rise due to teens experimenting with prescription drugs.

Health Risk- Sharing medications can lead to dangerous health consequences; like serious side effects and serious interaction with other drugs the individual may be taking.


Environmental Risk- Never flush or pour medications down the drain. Medications can have a negative effect on environment and most waste water facilities can't filter out drugs.

- 2. Get a free medication disposal bags, medication timer caps or locking medication pouches and boxes by calling Crossroads Prevention Services at: 434-392-9461.
- 3. Mixing: If no other method is available consumers can dispose of unwanted drugs through the following steps:
 - A. Remove labeling from the pill bottle.
 - B. Do not crush the pills or open capsules.
 - C. Mix the drugs with an unpleasant substance, such as kitty litter or coffee
